



Admission Requirements

The COSOPO Master's degree requires students to have an academic background in the field as well as complete a two-stage application procedure to officially be admitted to the program (including submitting an application to the institute). You must have:

- A Diploma or Bachelor's degree in a field of social sciences, economics or business, or a comparable academic degree program
- Sound background and knowledge of methodology in social sciences
- C1 level of proficiency in English (such as TOEFL/IELTS)

You must apply in advance for admission to enroll in the COSOPO Master's degree program. See jku. at/ma-cosopo for detailed information.
